THE EPISTLE - St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 7:26-28; 8:1-2

Brethren, it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, unstained, separated from sinners, exalted above the heavens. He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did this once for all when he offered up himself. Indeed, the law appoints men in their weakness as high priests, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever. Now the point in what we are saying is this: we have such a high priest, one who is seated at the right hand of the throne of the Majesty in heaven, a minister in the sanctuary and the true tent which is set up not by man but by the Lord.

THE GOSPEL - According to Luke 19:1-10

At that time, Jesus was passing through Jericho. And there was a man named Zacchaeus; he was a chief collector, and rich. And he sought to see who Jesus was, but could not, on account of the crowd, because he was small of stature. So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was to pass that way. And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, make haste and come down; for I must stay at your house today." So he made haste and came down, and received him joyfully. And when they saw it they all murmured, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor; and if I have defrauded any one of anything, I restore it fourfold." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man came to seek and to save the lost."

The Versis Center was blessed by Father Dimitri and Father Kallinikos with the cutting of the Vasilopita on Thursday, January 22nd.

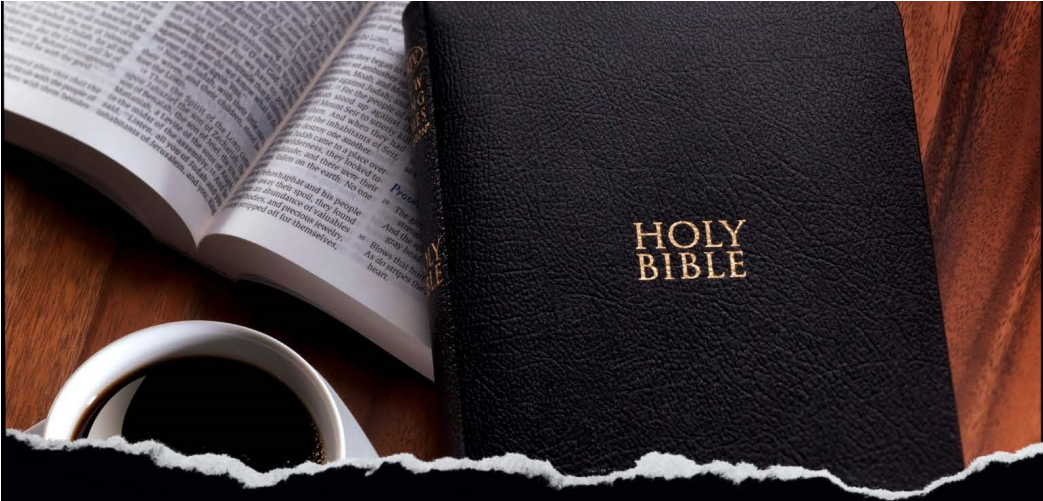
We thank our Maria Kafarakis for baking the delicious Vasilopita, which everyone enjoyed. The lucky coin was found by Andy J. Recachinas!

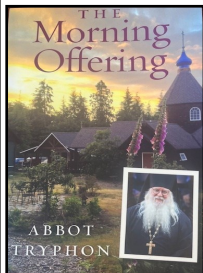

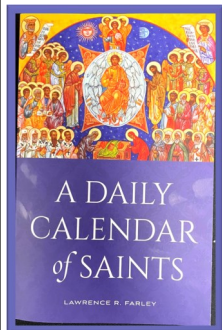
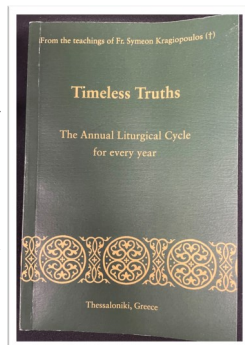


The Morning Offering - by Abbot Tryphon

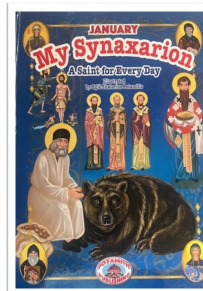


A Daily Calendar of Saints - by Fr. Lawrence Farley

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Because of excessive financial operational losses and constantly declining student enrollment for the past several years, the Parish Council was forced to the conclusion that the existence of our parochial school was no longer viable. Accordingly, by unanimous vote of all twenty members of the Council, the sad but necessary decision was made to close the School effective July 1st, 1988. A new school, independent of this Parish, is scheduled to open in September in the Bethesda area. We extend our best wishes to this effort and would hope that all of you who have children of primary school age will seriously consider this option. For further information you may contact MRS. ANDRIANA KALAPOTHAKOS or CHRIS DEMOPOULOS.

I am sure all our parishioners join me in welcoming our newly-appointed assistant priest, FATHER BASIL and PRESBYTERA RITA KISSAL with their two children, CONSTANTINE and GEORGE. FATHER BASIL, who was highly recommended to us by our PROESTAMENOS FATHER STAVRAKIS, comes to us from Albuquerque, New Mexico. Both Father and Presbyteria will have an opportunity to renew old acquaintances and friendships as they were born and grew up in Washington.

FATHER STAVRAKIS has begun his leave of absence, as previously noted, but will remain in the area and will be available to serve us should the need arise. FATHER VOYIAZAKIS, who is employed full time with the District of Columbia school system, will continue to assist our parish in a part-time capacity, as his schedule allows. We were pleased to see so many of you attend the Divine Liturgy on June 26 to worship with Father Nick and to wish him well. As always, we are indebted to our Ladies of Philoptochos for two lovely receptions -- the first honoring Father Stavrakis and the second on July 3 welcoming Father Kissal and his family.

I have reported to you earlier that the Parish Council is about to begin consideration of bids for the restoration of our church interior. I stress again to all of you how important it is that you make your contributions to this effort, if you have not already done so. The wives of the Parish Council, as well as MRS. JOHN KOPSIDAS who of course is the only lady on the Council, recently hosted a tea for this purpose,

which netted the handsome sum of \$2,000. A special thank you to ELENI RECACHINAS who opened her home to the ladies of our parish for this purpose.

The parish was saddened recently to learn of the passing of GUS ANDRAKAKOS, a lifelong member of the community and a past member of the Parish Council. We wish to express our deepest sympathy to his family and friends.
